As of right now the Medicare Advantage is at a standstill. A Manhattan Supreme Court justice, however, ruled in favor of a lawsuit by the NYC Organization of Public Service Retirees Oct. 21 that delayed the opt-out or -in deadline for city retirees. The original Oct. 31 deadline was not appropriate, the court ruled, especially because the choice is irreversible once decided by a retiree. "The Court feels that the method of implementation of this plan at present has been irrational, and thus arbitrary and capricious," Judge Lyle Frank wrote in his decision. "It is not in dispute that currently, in the midst of a pandemic, that has been hardest on the elderly and infirm, retirees have been given a deadline of October 31 to either do nothing in which case their health care plan will change, or to stay in their current plan in which they will likely have to pay what can only be described as a penalty.

"At the same time, there is little clarity as to which health care providers will be accepting this new Medicare Advantage Plan. It is simply irrational for retirees to have to make this decision as circumstances currently stand."

Judge Frank concluded that retirees required to opt in or out by the original deadline would be faced with "irreparable harm," and ordered that they remain in the current plan until the defects of the proposed new Medicare Advantage Plan are cured.

According to the NY Post, As of Monday 11/1/21, the deadline came and went for all of New York City's police to be vaccinated or face "disciplinary measures" starting with being put on unpaid leave. While it's true that vaccination rates did go up in the NYPD in the past couple of weeks, plenty of officers remain unvaccinated and many are awaiting the results of their applications for exemptions. But the cops with no other alternatives than the unemployment line may soon have a new opportunity in front of them. Out on the eastern end of Long Island in Suffolk County, the County Executive Steve Bellone announced that he will be hiring more than 700 new police officers. And to sweeten the deal a bit he's letting all potential applicants know that being vaccinated is optional. Police unions in the city are already taking notice and it won't be surprising if at least some of the thousands of disgruntled, unvaccinated NYPD officers start calling real estate agents on Long Island this week.

Democrat Eric Adams handily defeated Republican Curtis Sliwa with 66.5 percent of the vote. Adams promised to revisit the vaccine mandate for city employees as he spoke on Wednesday. He did say that he would not "step on De Blasio's toes" on the matter before he was sworn into office. The mayor-elect said that he planned to meet with union leaders, "and we're going to get this resolved." Eric Adams also promised he wouldn't "traumatize" retired city workers when it comes to their health coverage. Only time can tell.

Speaking of elections, it's election time for our club. All board member seats are up. If anyone is interested in a position, please let me know.


